**Horticulture:** The minor in Horticulture is designed to provide students educational opportunities in the area of ornamental horticulture as it relates to current urban environments. Emphasis is given to learning about the establishment and management of herbaceous and woody plants used in commercial and home settings. The program would complement the curricula of students interested in careers in various aspects of management and care of turf, parks, and recreational areas, and in landscaping planning. This minor requires the completion of a minimum of 16 hours of horticulture related courses with a grade of C or higher in each course. Required courses (7 hours): PLSC 206 and HORT 220. Minimum of 9 hours selected from the following courses: HORT 420, 441, 444, 445.

**Possible Job Tracks:** interior plantscaping, sustainability

### PROFESSIONAL FIELD EXPERIENCE

For each credit hour of internship earned, you must work and document 40 hours on the job.
